


I inspected the brakes which were a hydraulic equipped, dual circuit, disc brake front and drum brake rear system with a single reservoir 2/3 full of brake fluid. I tested the brakes and found that the vehicle had a low and firm pedal that operated at the front wheels only. The rear brake hydraulic system was grossly contaminated with air and the pedal required approximately four-to-five pedal 'pumps' to provide some rear brake retardation which is a dangerous condition, especially whilst laden and/or in an emergency braking situation. The left rear wheel cylinder was leaking which is unsatisfactory, however this leakage had been retained by the dust boots and not yet contaminated any of the associated friction The right rear brake assembly was grossly out of adjustment and required approximately five turns of the adjuster star wheel to return satisfactory adjustment: I saw that the adjuster star wheel and its associated locking tab had been fitted incorrectly, so the adjuster tab would not actually make contact with this star wheel and therefore possibly not maintain an adjusted condition. I saw that the rear brake shoes had been replaced reasonably recently which coincided with a badly scored right rear drum friction surface - This is possible evidence of a recent metal-to-metal brake condition and subsequent inadequate mechanical repairs, which may have also introduced air into the rear braking system. I bled the rear braking system, adjusted the rear brakes and found that the vehicle now had a full and hard brake pedal that operated at all road wheels. I saw that all brake pads and linings were of a satisfactory thickness and there were no other obvious or apparent leaks from the hydraulic system.

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I examined the steering and found that all steering components were connected and operational.

I checked the suspension and saw that all suspension components were connected and operational.

I inspected the electrical system and saw that all external lamps, the horn and windscreen wipers were intact. Both bullbar mounted parklamps, the bullbar mounted front indicators, the front spotlamps and right rear indicator were intact but inoperative. A number plate lamp was not fitted at all which is unsatisfactory. Musical air horns had been fitted which is undesirable. I saw that all other external lamps, a standard note air horn and the windscreen wipers were operating satisfactorily, however the windscreen wiper blades were in a badly deteriorated condition which is undesirable.

I inspected the wheels and saw that all tyres were inflated and of a satisfactory tread depth.

15 I am of the opinion that this vehicle was in a dangerous mechanical condition at the time of my inspection and test drive due to the limited operation of the braking system and the need to 'pump' the pedal to provide improved vehicle retardation; this is especially dangerous in an emergency braking situation where time to execute repeated applications can greatly increase a vehicles stopping distance.

20 Substandard mechanical repairs appeared to have been conducted on the vehicles rear brakes. Various lamps were inoperative and a number plate lamp was not fitted which is unsatisfactory. The windscreen wiper blades were

deteriorated and musical air horns had been fitted which is undesirable.



Burundi (pronounced /bəˈɹʊndɨ/), officially the Republic of Burundi (Kirundi: Republika y'u Burundi, [buˈrundi]; French: République du Burundi, [byˈʁyndi]), is a landlocked country in the Great Lakes region of Eastern Africa bordered by Rwanda to the north, Tanzania to the east and south, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo to the west. Its capital is Bujumbura. Although the country is landlocked, much of the southwestern border is adjacent to Lake Tanganyika.

Political unrest occurred throughout the region, in part, because of social differences between the Tutsi and Hutu, provoking civil war in Burundi throughout the middle twentieth century. Presently, Burundi is governed as a presidential representative democratic republic.

Burundi is one of the five poorest countries in the world. It has one of the lowest per capita GDPs of any nation in the world. [5] Burundi has a low gross domestic product largely due to civil wars, corruption, poor access to education, and the effects of HIV/AIDS^[citation needed]. Burundi is densely populated, with substantial emigration. Cobalt and copper are among Burundi's natural resources. Some of Burundi's main exports include coffee and sugar.

Kirundi, also known as **Rundi**, is a dialect of the Rwanda-Rundi language spoken by some 8.7 million people^[citation needed] in Burundi and adjacent parts of Tanzania and Congo-Kinshasa, as well as in Uganda. It is the official language of Burundi. (The *Kinyarwanda* dialect is the official language of neighboring Rwanda.)

The inhabitants of Rwanda and Burundi belong to several different ethnic groups: Hutu (84%), Tutsi, including Hima (15%), and Twa (1%) (a pygmy people). The fact that these ethnic groups share the same language is assumed to be the result of the Hutu outnumbering the latter two groups (see Hutu for a more complete historical perspective).

Neighboring dialects of Rundi are mutually intelligible with Ha, a language spoken in western Tanzania.

Rundi is frequently cited as a language where Meeussen's rule, a rule describing a certain pattern of tonal change in Bantu languages, is active.




