Although it is a relevant risk in this environment, we need to accept the risk as is, due to the fact that the prisoners are already issued with batteries in their TV remote controls and walkmans. The batteries offer a safer option than the prisoners being able to remove blades from the manual razors they are presently using, these are smaller and can be hidden more easily

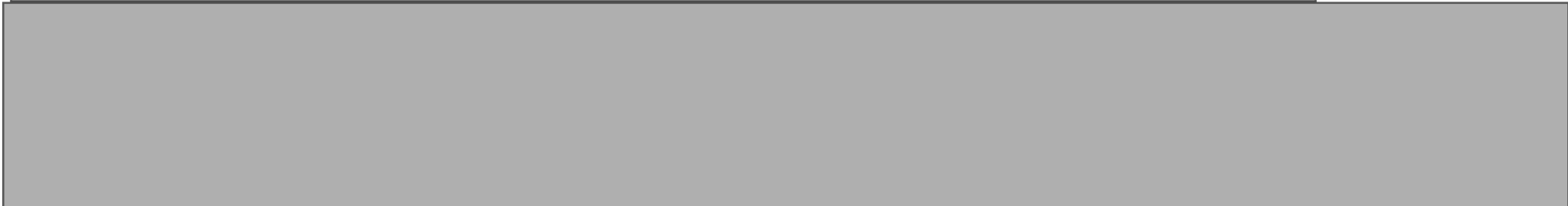
