

#### STATUTORY DECLARATION

QUEENSLAND) TO WIT )

> I, David John WILLIAMS of Townsville In the state of Queensland, do Solemnly and sincerely declare that:

1. I am a legally qualified Medical Practitioner and am registered in Queensland as an Eminent Senior Specialist Pathologist. I am a Consultant Forensic and Anatomical Pathologist employed by Queensland Health. I am also an Associate Clinical Professor of Pathology at the University of Queensland. I am Director of Anatomical Pathology at Townsville General Hospital and I am a Clinical Professor of Pathology at James Cook University. I am a Government Medical Officer for Townsville.

I possess both scientific qualifications and medical qualifications.

My scientific qualifications include a Bachelor of Science (with Honours) in Chemistry from the University of Wales and I also have a Master of Science in Forensic Science. I also have a Diploma in Science German. I am an Adjunct Professor to the Faculty of Science and Technology, Griffith University.

My medical qualifications include the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery from the University of Glasgow. I have a Doctorate of Philosophy (Ph.D) in Forensic Medicine from the University of Glasgow.

I am a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists (London) and a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia. I possess the Diploma in Medical Jurisprudence in Pathology and I am a former member of the British Society of Neuropathology and am currently a member of the Australian Society of Neuropathology.

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11. I found a dint to the rear rim on the left hand side. I further located some scuffing to the right hand side hand brake and rear of the seat. I then measured the distance from the road to the top

of the seat and found it to be 92 centremetres.

12. I then made an inspection of the roadway. I found that the area in which the crash occurred was

on a short bridge bordered by ARMCO railings. The carriageway itself was bordered by fog

lines. The lanes were separated by double continuous lines and were aligned in a north-west to

south-east direction.

13. I measured the width of the lane in the area of the incident and found it to be 3.4 metres wide. I

further measured the shoulder of the road from the fog line to the edge of seal to be

approximately ninety (90) centremetres in width. I also measured from the edge of seal to the

ARMCO railing and found it to be approximately seventy-five (75) centremetres in width. This

final section was made up of gravel.

14. The carriageway was constructed of bitumen in good condition. The lines were also of good

condition. Whilst the bridge is on a slight curve it is open and long with excellent visibility. The

speed zone for this section of roadway is 80km/phr.

15. This roadway is utilised by all forms of vehicles and is a major arterial joining Ring Road to the

Bruce Highway. I found no potholes, debris or oil on the roadway that may have contributed to

the incident.

16. The weather conditions at the time were fine and sunny. Visibility was excellent with no fog or

haze evident.

17. I then made an inspection of the incident scene and located two (2) separate pools of what

appeared to be blood. I further located several scuff marks in the dirt between where the edge of

seal stopped and the ARMCO railing began. Due to the bicycles being moved prior to arrival of

police it was unsure what scuffing was caused by which bicycle.

18. I then directed Constable MALONEY who was authorised to drive the class of vehicle involved

in this incident to move the vehicle to the area of the incident and position it inside the lane.

Whilst Constable MALONEY moved this vehicle I observed that when he rotated the steering

wheel the steer wheels also moved and when he stopped the vehicle it did so appropriately.

19. I found that in the normal driving position of the vehicle the load projected over the centre line

and left hand fog line.

20. I then retrieved the helmet worn by the bicycle rider and deceased person and found an indent in

the rear with a blue mark. Beside this indent I also located another indent with a red mark.

21. I then inspected the edge of the load and found it to be timber with what appeared to be blue paint

on the face of it. Beside this I found a steel run which was red in colour.

22. I measured the section of timber on the outside of the load and found it to be approximately 6.5

centremetres wide. I then measured the distance from the road to the bottom edge of the piece of

timber on the edge of the load and found it to be 1.42 metres.

23. I then put the rear of the helmet up against the timber edge and found that both indents fitted the

profile of the edge of the load.

24. As Constable MALONEY had to depart the scene I directed Constable MIDDLETON of the

Mundingburra Police to drive the vehicle involved and I directed him into a position where the

right hand edge of the load was relatively in line with the left hand side of the centre double

continuous white line.

25. On inspecting the left hand side of the load I found it to be between the fog line and the edge of

the edge of seal.
