I have researched the file contents and have determined that a breach under section 148A may not be able to be substantiated. Extensive investigation are required to make this determination. Given that this file should have been addressed much earlier then this date I deemed it not appropriate that any further action be taken regarding a possible breach of section 148A. I also feel that on the evidence contained in the file I don't believe the venue could have averted the assault from happening. Practices could be change to better manage issues of an alike nature but again it is a long straw to say that the venue failed to maintain a safe environment.</p> |

OLGR requests the following information be provided by Queensland Police

Service to assist establishing the facts of the matters:

- Advise if it has been established from witnesses and the licensee that a regular glass pot was used by the offender.
- Advise if the victim received injuries and any details that may be known.
- Advise if the injuries were the result of an altercation where the offender deliberately pushed or propelled the 'glass' into the victim as a weapon and caused injuries to the victim.
- Summaries of QP9's.
- Summaries of Victim reports.

Any breaches of the Liquor Act 1992 that are substantiated may result in enforcement action against the Licensee, Approved Manager and any other person in control of the premises at the time in the Magistrates Court or by way of disciplinary action under the provisions of Liquor Act 1992.

OLGR would appreciate any assistance provided by Queensland Police Service in relation to this matter. Unfortunately I have until lunch time on Friday 29 January 2010 to have both these reports submitted, so can I please request this information urgently.

During the discussion several initiatives were considered for implementation to prevent further incidents of this nature occurring at the premises, including –

1. That the lighting within the different bars of the premises be increased to allow for better observations of patron behavior by security.
2. That a crowd controller be stationed in the lane way on the eastern end of the premises to prevent assaults within the laneway and to observe patron interaction with members of the public on the street.
3. That a more comprehensive banning process be put in place to control the entry of regular trouble makers into the premises.
4. Explore the possibility of installing a ID scanner to identify and prevent entry of people who are responsible for anti social behavior.
5. To have sufficient crowd controller's rostered on to enable the placing of a crowd controller in each bar area that is in operation to control anti social behaviors.

The Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation view incidents of this type seriously and believe that immediate implementation of remedial action needs to take place to prevent further violence type incidents. It is requested that within fourteen days of receiving this letter that you advise in writing outlining what initiatives have been implemented or are intended to be implement in the near future to prevent further incidents.

(M) patron moved aggressively towards - him. Myself & guard #42 restrained him. He swung at guard #42 so we restrained him on the ground. We then picked him up and removed him down the stairs. When we got to the stairs 1x (M) patron in drag intervened in the eviction. He became aggressive towards myself & after refusing my request to leave the premises I proceeded to restrain him. His friend then grabbed me from behind and started threatening me. Guard #50 restrained the drag queen & I told the other patron to let go of me. He moved in front of me and struck me in the chest & the throat. All available guards then assisted to remove both patrons from the premises.

At the time of Police attendance Police observed approximately 4 - 5 security officers of the Beat Nightclub who appeared to be goading INFORMANT into a physical altercation. Police attempted to segregate INFORMANT and VIC from security providers. At that time INFORMANT was highly agitated however not aggressive with neither Police nor security providers. VIC was highly distressed as a result of the physical altercation with security within the premises. Police observed two security providers in particular on a number of occasions continue to approach and physically provoke both VIC and INFORMANT despite Police presence and control. Shortly thereafter Police observed senior security providers usher the agitated security officers back inside the licensed premises at that time.

Police spoke with security officers present in relation what INFORMANT and VIC had done inside to warrant the eviction and extreme physical handling. Security's only response at that time was to the effect of 'can you just move them on'. Nil arrests made. INFORMANT stated to Police he did not wish to make a complaint of assault however stated he wished for a report of the incident to be generated. As such details of security providers were not obtained at that time.

Receipt is also acknowledged of documentation provided as requested in Mr Makepeace's email of 28 August 2013.

I would like to advise that no further action will be taken in relation to this matter, however I do wish to reinforce section 148A of the Act which outlines the legislative obligations placed upon licensees and permittees relating to the service, supply and promotion of liquor.

Section 148A of the Act requires that a licensee maintains a safe environment for patrons and staff at all times on and around the licensed premises and that alcohol is supplied in a manner that is consistent with minimising harm.

The provisions highlight the legislative responsibilities placed upon licensees and staff to ensure that alcohol is supplied in a manner conducive to the Act's main objective of minimising harm.

There has been many allegations made by the INFORMANT and VIC. On disc 1 you can clearly see security talking to the male's and asking them to leave. I personally can not see the INFORMANT being placed in a neck restraint nor being thrown down the stairs. Disc 2 covers the staircase. If a person was thrown down this staircase, its my firm belief that they would require assistance from QAS. Disc 3 covers foyer and outside footage.

(2) Arrived at 3:40am and asked (M) to leave the premises due to unruly behavior from the customer club. Several male patrons asked him to leave several times but he refused to leave. At 3:49am and 3:59am locked him out of the club. (M) turned aggressive towards #42 and #21 while he had a glass in his hands. So I grabbed the glass from his hands and escort him out with appropriate and proportional force with the assistance of #79. While outside EMS was there and they took over the situation. (M) was about 28 years old, 6'1" tall, average built, Caucasian, black hair, blue t-shirt and jeans. (M) was about 30 years old, 6'3" tall, solid built, tanned complexion, black hair, was wearing black jacket and jeans.

I have enclosed all documentation relating to inv143245. This matter was handled by the Fortitude Valley Police and I was under the impression that Senior Constable Darrin Griffiths (21967) CIB was in charge of this case.

Both I and the Police Officers have spent many hours reviewing CCTV footage and cannot substantiate the claims that have been made. Not only were the claims being changed by the alleged victim but also the suspect kept on changing. It's my personal belief that this alleged incident never took place.

Main Points

1. The alleged victim and his friend were scanned in via security at 11:24:49 on 09/01/14. (colour scanned images provided)
2. The alleged victim and his friend after talking to security re directions left the venue at approx 02:07am on 10/01/14. (CCTV disc- front door cams- provided)
3. At no time did the alleged victim and or his friend approach management, bar staff and or security about an incident in the main room male toilets.
4. Upon reviewing the footage in the main room males toilets the Police and myself found that the alleged victim had not been in the toilets between 01:00 – 02:07. I can not see how the event took place if he wasn't even in the location. (please view CCTV disc – main bar male toilets 01:00 – 02:07).
5. I suggested to police if we can get a description of the suspect we could go through our id eye scanning system as everyone is scanned coming into the venue. It went from one description to 3 different males.

I was in Main Bar smoking area and as I walked towards the non smoking area I heard one female say to another female, "My sister was just paying you a compliment." The second female was a group of three males and two other females. She started abusing one of the sisters by calling her a 'slut and bitch.' Guard 10 and I witnessed the female throw a bottle at one of the sisters and hit her on the forehead. I called for security. The other sister attacked the female. One of the guys from the group attacked the sister. As security arrived we broke the fight up between the girls. One of the other guys tried to get involved. We locked him up. As all the guards got there I told them which patrons I wanted out of the venue and which female had to be held at the foyer because she had thrown a bottle and caused injury to the other female. As we got them all outside of door 1, I noticed at door 2 one of the sisters was being aggressive to our guards. I went down to explain that one of guards was applying first aid to her sister and that she would be out soon. I told her that we were doing our job and to not be aggressive to us and that we had the police on our way to deal with the other party. One of the guards told me there were two officers across the road walking down the road. I crossed the road and told them we needed assistance to hold this group of patrons. As we crossed the road, there two females up the laneway punching on. We ran up to break that fight up. I radioed guard 30 and told him we needed city safe to send more officers because we had the current incident and now an incident in the laneway. As the police officers arrived, I told one of them that we held a group of patrons at door 1 for one incident where a bottle had been thrown and struck a female and I told the other one about the two females in laneway punching on. I told them the two females were asked to leave the venue earlier on in the night. The one female that got arrested, I had already spoken to her earlier in the night. The officers took over the situation.
