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The centre did not have an Incentives and Enhancements Program in place.

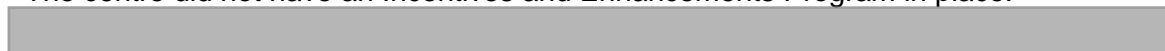
