	The Capricornia Correctional Centre is currently above capacity and that does place a higher demand on prisoner support services and infrastructure. Additional staff have been provided to support the needs of prisoners at times when the facility is above capacity.
	During the 2015/16 financial year (to 9 March 2016) there has been one sexual assault reported (in August 2015).



Thank you for your letter dated 17 May 2016 regarding a report of the visit to the Capricornia Correctional Centre (CCC) from 21 to 23 March 2016.

I note your comments and recommendations, and provide the following in response.

#### Overcrowding

Queensland Corrective Services (QCS) is committed to alleviating prisoner capacity pressure in Queensland correctional centres. In the interim, QCS has been using double up placements to manage surges in prisoner numbers including using 'buddy cells' and temporary bunk beds, trundle beds and mattresses in secure cells or residential areas.

Options exist to build additional prison capacity at a number of existing correctional centres in Queensland. In particular, these include the Southern Queensland, Arthur Gorrie, and Capricornia Correctional Centres. A further option includes the expansion of capacity by building new facilities at the Southern Queensland Correctional Precinct at Gatton. While a range of options exist, they must be considered by Government through the normal infrastructure planning and budgetary processes.
