- Management only employs crowd controllers licensed under the Security Providers Act 1993;
- A register and copy of current licenses under the Security providers Act 1993 of crowd controllers are kept by management;
- All crowd controllers are RSA trained and have signed our House Policy;
- A register and copy of security RSA are kept and maintained by management;
- Crowd controllers will inform management of unduly intoxicated patrons before removing them from the premises;
- Management will provide taxis or other form of transport for unduly intoxicated patrons on leaving the hotel;
- Crowd controllers will be advised to encourage a good will between patrons and themselves while providing a safe and enjoyable environment for patrons;
- Crowd controllers will not use excessive force in removing patrons;
- CCTV is operational at entries and exits on the premises;
- CCTV footage is held for a minimum of 28 days;
- Crowd controllers will be encouraged to use law enforcement if needed;
- Signage in and around the hotel will be used to set protocols on refusal of entry to patrons;
- We at all times provide a safe environment to our patrons;
- All crowd controllers are to be able to provide their license to Police and Divisional Field officers;
- All crowd controllers are to wear their security ID on their chest showing the identification number allocated to them, as required under the Security Providers Act 1993;
- Crowd controllers are to understand all the requirements made of them during work hours;
- Security is to be
 - o Dressed in the same uniforms;
 - o Easily distinguishable from patrons;
 - o Maintain a non-aggressive attitude at all times; and
 - o Use only reasonable force;

WOOLLY MAMMOTH ALEHOUSE crowd controllers comply with the following ratio in venues that require, under law, the use of crowd controllers:

- 1 to 100 patrons of part thereof-1 crowd controller
- More than 100 patrons but not more than 200 patrons 2 crowd controllers
- More than 200 patrons but not more than 300 patrons 3 crowd controllers
- More than 300 patrons but not more than 400 patrons 4 crowd controllers
- More than 400 patrons but not more than 500 patrons 5 crowd controllers
- Plus at least 1 crowd controller for every 250 patrons (or part) thereafter (This condition does not apply on nights the premises do not see or supply liquor beyond 1am)

All crowd controllers are to be familiar with the premise Fire Safety Procedures (refer Safety Procedures)

- Crowd controllers are to monitor the number of people within the premise at all times (hand-held counters and/or hourly head counts);
- Ensure that the premise does not exceed the maximum number permitted inside the premises by the Queensland Fire and Safety Authority;
- Ensure that all exits are kept clear at all times;

At all times crowd controllers will remain;

- o Vigilant in in-house security;
- o Remain on the premise during rostered shifts;
- Follow the direction of management and the directors of the company;
- o With a .00 blood alcohol level, while performing work duties;
- Compliant under the Security Providers Act 1993.

Crowd controller will not engage in;

- o Consumption of alcohol
- o Smoking
- o Arguments with patron
- o A crude manner towards employees or patrons
- o Careless behaviour
- o Possession of drugs or illegal dealings
- O Possession of alcohol
