This email is to provide comment to an application received by [redacted] Sch 4/3/2 under guideline 59: Declaration of licensed premises (or part) as 'not regulated for ID scanning' issued by the Commissioner for the Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation. This guideline allows the Commissioner the capacity to declare a licensed premise, or part of a licensed premise, as not regulated for ID scanning.

In April 2017, a similar application was denied.

The applicant, on this occasion is requesting the whole of the licensed premises be declared not regulated for ID scanning, which is currently required by section 173EH of the Liquor Act 1992.

Description of Site and Surrounding Area

- [redacted] 4/3/2 Cairns Safe Night Precinct [redacted]
[redacted] The licensee is [redacted] 4/3/2 The licence type is 'Commercial Special Facilities'. The premises currently trade from 9am until 2am Monday to Sunday.
- The premises have been trading at its current location [redacted] Sch 4/3/2 and consist of a mix of restaurant dining, pizzeria, live entertainment platforms, and high-end bar facilities. The liquor licence is subjected to demanding conditions which include security, complaints register, and a range of noise level variations requiring the use of a sound limiting device.
- [redacted] 4/3/2 has two entry and exit points and operate an ID scanner after 10pm at each point. The premises are open plan and access can be gained by motivated patrons without passing through the ID scanning points (garden area, garden bed and Pizzeria).

Legislative Obligations

- As you will be aware, as of the 1 July 2017, licensed premises approved on a permanent basis to trade between 12am and 5am in an SNP must operate an ID scanner at each entry point.

- The current licence type and location of 4/3/2 including permanent approved trading hours until 2am, dictates the premises must comply with the ID scanning provisions as set in section 173EH of the Liquor Act 1992.
- Accordingly, as District Officer of the Far North District, I object to this application being granted.
