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Proposed trading conditions

1. Approved liquor may be sold for both on-premises and takeaway consumption on the same day
2. Trading hours of:
 - Tues 4pm-10pm clubhouse – patrons & 10.30pm - 11.30pm staff drinks (to be limited to 2 cans per person mid strength beer only)
 - Wed 4pm-10pm clubhouse – patrons & 10.30pm - 11.30pm staff drinks (to be limited to 2 cans per person mid strength beer only)
 - Thurs 4pm-10pm clubhouse – patrons & 10.30pm - 11.30pm staff drinks (to be limited to 2 cans per person mid strength beer only)
 - Fri 4pm-10pm clubhouse – patrons & 10.30pm - 11.30pm staff drinks (to be limited to 2 cans per person mid strength beer only)
 - Sat 4pm-10pm clubhouse – patrons & 10.30pm - 11.30pm staff drinks (to be limited to 2 cans per person mid strength beer only)
3. The approved hours of the premises during 'special events' are 5pm to 12 midnight. An example of a 'special event' is State of Origin.
4. The licensee must advise and obtain written support of the police, council and Community Justice Group prior to trading during a 'special event'
5. The sale of takeaway liquor is restricted to the proposed carriage limit (yet to be determined) per person per day (*Note: the takeaway limit may be lower than the carriage limit but may not exceed the carriage limit*)
6. The licensee and approved manager/s must ensure crowd controllers licensed under the *Security Providers Act 1993* are employed in the following ratios from 4:00pm until one hour after the premises ceases to supply liquor:
 - 51 to 100 patrons - 1 crowd controller
 - 101 to 200 patrons - 2 crowd controllers
 - 201 to 300 patrons - 3 crowd controllers
 - More than 300 patrons - 4 crowd controllers
7. The licensee and approved manager/s must ensure two RSA Marshals are employed at the premises from 4:00pm until thirty minutes after the premises ceases to supply liquor
8. The licensee and approved manager/s must ensure that RSA Marshals physically 'sign in' on a RSA Marshals specific register when commencing duty and 'sign out' when finishing duty



9. RSA Marshals are to be dressed so as to be clearly distinguishable from crowd controllers and patrons, and are to act as a link between management, staff and security to identify patrons who:
 - a) are becoming or have the potential to become unduly intoxicated, agitated, unruly, or aggressive;
 - b) require cutting off from liquor or eviction from the premises.

10. The sale or supply of liquor is restricted to a maximum of ten (10) standard drinks per person per day consisting of either:
 - a) 10 x 375 ml cans of mid strength beer, cider, or pre-mixed drinks, where the alcohol content by volume is no greater than 4%; or
 - b) 6 x 375 ml cans of mid strength beer, cider, or pre-mixed drinks, where the alcohol content by volume is no greater than 4% and two (2) piccolos (187 ml) of wine.

11. Liquor may not be sold in glass containers

12. Liquor may be sold or supplied only whilst the premises adheres to its principal activity of the provision of facilities and services to the club's members and the achievement of the club's objects

13. Liquor may not be sold for consumption off the licensed premises after 10:00pm or be taken away from the premises after 10:30pm

14. Noise emanating from the premises including amplified and/or non-amplified noise and/or patron noise must not exceed 75dB(C), fast response, when measured approximately 3 metres from the primary source of the noise

15. Non-amplified entertainers or speakers used to amplify noise must not be located in any outdoor, verandah, patio or footpath area of the premises.



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
